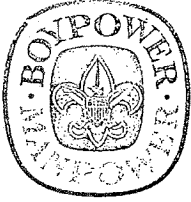

Dear Mr. Paulson:

Recently Paul McCadam came to us on an interview for professional employment with our council. We have decided not to hire Paul and we felt that you should know our reasons.

Mr. McCadam was to graduate in June with a major in Psychology and a minor in Sociology. At 23 he is a part owner of a laundromat and shows a good degree of aggressiveness.

While the interview showed Mr. McCadam's attitude is generally satisfactory there were three areas which make us feel he would not fit into our needs.

First, and probably least important, is the fact that his Scouting experience is limited to three years as a Cub Scout and three years as a Boy Scout with the highest rank being First Class.

Secondly, he was concerned as to whether his Scouting career would have to be with him at all times. He indicated that he desired to have a private life as a bachelor with a typical bachelor's apartment and seemed to feel that the two might not be compatible.

Finally, when I indicated that the interview had been satisfactory, that it seemed he could do the job and that I would so indicate this to the Scout Executive, he said, "Now I must tell you that I am an alcoholic and a homosexual." He further questioned whether or not the Boy Scouts of America could prevent homosexuals from their membership. When I indicated that the Boy Scouts of America, as a private organization, had the right to exclude any individual for just cause such as moral character, he did indicate that he could understand this.

Why Mr. McCadam would say these things, I am not sure. Certainly, he could do Scouting no service by talking in this manner as a professional. As a

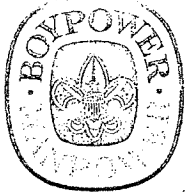

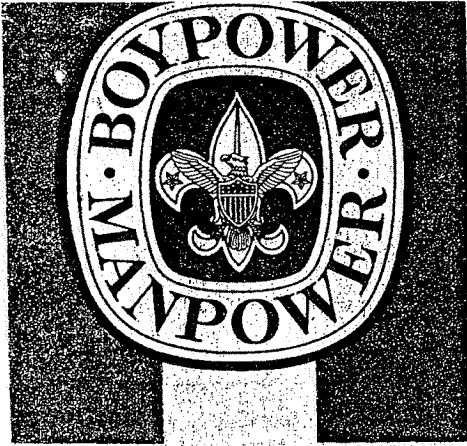
