

I was seated on the bus, 4th seat
from the front, left side next to [REDACTED]
[REDACTED], when Mr. Martin took [REDACTED]
to get up because he wanted
to talk to me. [REDACTED] left the
seat next to me and went to another
seat.

Mr. Martin sat down next to me and
placed his arm around my shoulder and
said "You my daddy - ain't you?" - I
didn't answer him. Then he said: "Do
you want to learn some hand signals?"
Then he raised my shirt and started
to put his hands down the front of my
trousers. I pushed his arm away and
got up from the seat next to him. Then
he said "Don't you want to learn the
hand signals?" I said "No", and he said
"don't then" and I went to another seat.

He sat on that seat for about ten
minutes and then moved to the back
of the bus next to [REDACTED]

To Whom it may concern -

Following is a series of events as related to me by my sons [redacted] beginning at Camp "Northern Lights" Thursday July 20th 1967 and ending Saturday July 22nd 1967.

[redacted] having been restricted to camp for visiting the Trading Post without permission, was led by Mr. Richard Martin to an empty camp site where said Martin pulled down his bucking trucks and thereupon spanked him at least 5 times on his buttocks and then tried to lay his hand on his penis where upon [redacted] broke loose from said Martin who in the meantime warned [redacted] that there were no witnesses and not to report any of the aforementioned happenings to anyone whatsoever.

On Saturday July 22nd on the bus ride home Martin again accosted [redacted] in the rear of the bus, called him by the name of "[redacted]" and again tried to lay his hand on [redacted]'s person whereupon [redacted] broke from him and removed himself to a seat further ahead in the bus after

~~from~~ this event with [redacted] he enticed [redacted] who was sitting in the rear looking out of the back window of the bus with no companion when Martin asked him if he

was " [redacted] " brother. When [redacted] replied in the affirmative he said in effect - "you'll be just as good" and he held [redacted] by the arms with one hand & trying to feel his penis with the other [redacted] then broke away from him and went forward in the bus & took another seat.

Prior to this event with [redacted] [redacted] was in the rear of the bus with Joe McAndrews, a fellow scout, when Martin also held [redacted] hands & tried to feel him in the penis.

These are the events as my sons have related them to me.

While coming home on the bus from Northern Lights "Boy Scout Camp" my son [REDACTED] was sleeping in the back of the bus alone. Richard Martin came back and said "you are my buddy [REDACTED] He told [REDACTED] he was going to tickle him but [REDACTED] said no because he didn't feel good. Martin then put [REDACTED] hands behind his back and held them with his left hand. He opened his pants buckle and put his hands on his privates and proceeded to molest him. [REDACTED] asked him to please stop but he kept on, he told him again but he (Martin) said just a few more minutes. He told [REDACTED] not to tell his parents and that he would come and pick him up some night and show him how its really done. The bus stopped and every body got out to get something to eat. Martin got back on and approached [REDACTED] again. He told him not to do it again but could not stop him because he squeezed him so hard he could not breathe. [REDACTED] finally got away because Dave Zimmerman

GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

All persons serving in any official relationship with the Boy Scouts of America shall subscribe to the statement of religious principle . . . the Scout Oath and Law, and these Bylaws. Such persons shall be citizens of the United States, or . . . shall have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the United States, or, in the case of minors, shall take an oath of allegiance to the flag and Government of the United States, or shall satisfy the requirements of Article XVI, Section 6, Clause 4 with respect to visiting adult aliens. Article XVIII, Section 2.

PURPOSE: CHARACTER BUILDING — CITIZENSHIP TRAINING

The purpose of the Corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in the Act of Incorporation enacted by the Congress of the United States of America on June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use

THE SCOUT OATH OR PROMISE

On my honor I will do my best
To do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law;
To help other people at all times;
To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.

THE SCOUT LAW

1. A Scout is trustworthy.
A Scout's honor is to be trusted. If he were to violate his honor by telling a lie or by cheating or by not doing exactly a given task, when trusted on his honor, he may be directed to hand over his Scout badge.
2. A Scout is loyal.
He is loyal to all to whom loyalty is due, his Scout leader, his home and parents and country.
3. A Scout is helpful.
He must be prepared at any time to save life, help injured persons, and share the home duties. He must do at least one Good Turn to somebody every day.
4. A Scout is friendly.
He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.
5. A Scout is courteous.
He is polite to all, especially to women, children, old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous.
6. A Scout is kind.
He is a friend to animals. He will not kill nor hurt any living creature needlessly, but will strive to save and protect all harmless life.
7. A Scout is obedient.
He obeys his parents, Scoutmaster, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities.

BOYS' LIFE

Registered adult members are entitled to a half-price membership rate of \$1.50 a year or 12½ cents a month. (Regular rate is \$3.) A *Boys' Life* subscription should be for the same number of months as an individual's registration, but the first issue of *Boys' Life* will not normally arrive for approximately 2 months. Your local council will transmit your subscription on the appropriate unit or council roster form.

Boys' Life is published by the Boy Scouts of America and contains some of the best of fiction, hobbies, crafts, sports, and outdoor crafts and skills. Program material is coordinated with unit program themes.

APPROVAL

The application of the Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Explorer Advisor, and their assistants and Den Mothers should be approved by the chairman of the unit committee. Applications of unit committeemen and the institutional representative must be approved by the head of the institution or sponsoring Body. Council Scouters should be approved by the proper council authority.

REGISTRATION FEES

If applicant already holds an unexpired registration certificate in another capacity, no fee is required with this application, unless he is ceasing activity in the other capacity. In such case he should pay a proportionate fee to the expiration of this registration.

Annual adult fee is \$1, but for periods of less than 1 year, registration will be proportionate to the period to be covered, as shown on the front side.

by Boy Scouts." In achieving this purpose, emphasis shall be placed upon its educational program and the oaths, promises and codes of the Scout program for character development, citizenship training, mental and physical fitness. Article I, Section 2.

DECLARATION OF RELIGIOUS PRINCIPLE

The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizen without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Scout Oath or Promise the boy declares, "On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law." The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the religious faith of the boy may be, the fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the organization or institution with which the Scout is connected shall give definite attention to his religious life.

Only persons willing to subscribe to this declaration of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Scout program. Article II, Section 2.

8. A Scout is cheerful.
He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheery. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.
9. A Scout is thrifty.
He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his money so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or Good Turns.
10. A Scout is brave.
He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him.
11. A Scout is clean.
He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits, and travels with a clean crowd.
12. A Scout is reverent.
He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.
